## 2021 REGIONAL NEEDS ASSESSMENT KEY FINDINGS

In 2021, Collin County's population makeup was approximately 55% White Alone, 16% Hispanic, 10% Black Alone, 15% Asian and 3% identifying as a race other than listed. (Texas Demographic Center)



Collin County saw an estimated 11.8% population increase from 2017 to 2021; the second highest of all Region 3 counties. (Texas Demographic Center)



In 2019, 28.7% of Collin County residents were bilingual or multilingual; this was the third highest rate in Region 3. (U.S. Census Bureau)



In 2019, Collin County had the second highest median household income of all Region 3 counties at \$96,913; this is higher than Texas and United States [\$61,874 and \$62,843]. (U.S. Census Bureau)



During the 2020-2021 school year, the rate of students experiencing homelessness in Collin County was 3.7 per 1,000 students. (Texas Education Agency)



At 52.3%, Collin County has the highest rate of adults 25 years and older with a bachelor's degree or higher in Region 3 for 2019. (U.S. Census Bureau)



In 2019, Collin County's rate of violation of probation for those aged 10-17 was 3.1 per 1,000 population; the third highest in the region. (Texas Juvenile Justice Department)



In 2020, Collin County had the second lowest social association rate in Region 3. (County Health Rankings & Roadmaps)



In 2019, the age-adjusted suicide rate was 10.9 per 100,000 population in Collin County. (CDC WONDER)



As of July 2021, Collin County had 9 licensed substance abuse and 8 mental health treatment providers. (SAMHSA)
